# Understanding Trauma & Grief, A Community Response Through Care and Connection.

This seventh module will communicate how to deal with community trauma after experiencing a potentially psychologically traumatic event or critical incident.

We will cover:

- Community Trauma, a phenomenon that occurs after a traumatic event causes community members to experience unusually strong emotional reactions that might get in the way of their ability to return to daily activities.
- Psychological First Aid, a technique designed to reduce the occurrence of post-traumatic stress disorder. A personal understanding of the effects of stress, loss, trauma and grief on others is integral to providing effective PFA.
