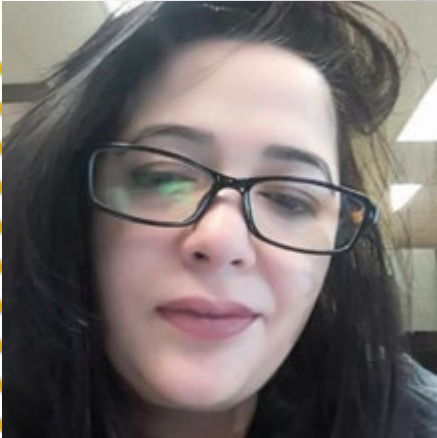

ELORA FERDOUS

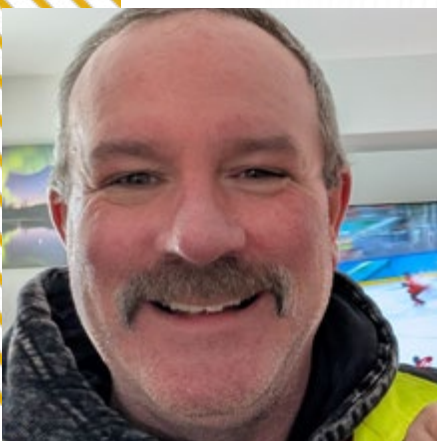

Morning Exercise – The Road to Recovery

Provincial Partners in Emergency Management



When disaster strikes, the immediate focus is on response. Yet once the initial response subsides, a new and equally complex phase begins: recovery. Both phases must be built on a solid foundation of planning, training, and preparedness. Recovery is often referred to as the “disaster after the disaster,” recovery is where communities face the long-term challenges of rebuilding and restoring normal life. Recovering from a large-scale event requires coordinated efforts across multiple partners, including provincial stakeholders, local agencies, and community organizations all working together to assist the community. The objective is not only to return the community to its pre-event condition as quickly as possible, but to do so in a way that strengthens resilience for the future. In this exercise, you will work through a large-scale disaster recovery scenario alongside provincial stakeholders to learn how the many pieces of the recovery puzzle come together to restore stability and support community renewal.

Community lessons learned from Manitoba Wildfires 2025

In late May 2025, escalating wildfire activity near Tataskweyak Cree Nation (TCN) triggered a rapid, multi-day emergency response involving the Town of Gillam (TOG), Manitoba Hydro, First Nation leadership, provincial and federal authorities, and numerous partner agencies. What began as information gathering quickly evolved into a complex, large-scale evacuation under highly volatile weather conditions and extreme logistical constraints.
